The Royal College of Paediatrics and Child Health (RCPCH), working with the Association for Children's Palliative Care (ACT) in 1997, defined the concept of life-limiting condition through a series of archetype descriptions (Table 1), but did not attempt to name specific diagnoses except as exemplars. If, however, children are to have the same access to specialist palliative interventions as adults currently enjoy, service developers must engage commissioners.

What is paediatric palliative care ? 'Palliative care for children and young people with life-limiting conditions is an active and total approach to care, embracing physical, emotional, social and spiritual elements.

Palliative care : About palliative care

Paediatric palliative care (PPC) is care which focuses on the relief of suffering in the child and family by controlling pain and other distressing symptoms, by integrating the psychological and spiritual aspects of care, by offering a support system to allow children and their families to live as active and full a life as possible and by supporting families to help them cope into bereavement.

A National Model of Care for Paediatric Healthcare ...

Semi-structured interviews were conducted with families of children with LLCs, selected to encompass all Association for Children's Palliative Care (ACT)/Royal College of Paediatrics and Child Health (RCPCH) categories, using a schedule developed from focus groups of professionals. Thirty out of 76 families agreed to participate.

In industrialized countries the majority of children cared for in Pediatric Palliative Care (PPC) programs have non-malignant diseases other than cancer. This includes a very broad range of conditions affecting the brain, the muscles, the heart and lungs. Infrequently there are infectious and immunologic conditions.

Paediatric palliative care enables the baby, child or young adult to live in an environment where curative treatment can be part of their life, but not their entire focus. It aims to provide the best quality of life through a holistic approach which supports the physical, emotional, social and spiritual aspects of the child and their family.
