The Stanford-Binet is an individually administered adaptive intelligence test. While the WISC-V is now the most commonly administered IQ test for children, the Stanford-Binet has been around the longest. It measures five weighted factors in both verbal and nonverbal abilities. The five factors are: knowledge, quantitative reasoning, visual-spatial processing, working memory, and fluid reasoning.

The Stanford-Binet is a standardized test, meaning that norms were established during the design phase of the test by administering the test to a large, representative sample of the test population. The test has a mean, or average, standard score of 100 and a standard deviation of 16 (subtests have a mean of 50 and a standard deviation of 8).

Similar questions appear on IQ tests such as the WISC-V and the Stanford-Binet. Paper folding is a measure of visual-spatial awareness. Students review a series of pictures that show a piece of paper being folded and cut. Students must determine what the paper will look like when it is unfolded.
